

# Postclassical Narratology.

## Cultural, Historical, and Cognitive Aspects of Narrative Theory

Narratology in its postclassical phase goes beyond the consideration of textual features alone, and also considers the production and/or reception aspects of narratives (rhetorical, cognitive, and affective narratology), the development of certain narrative structures in specific historical periods (historical narratology), and the analysis of the various negotiations of cultural aspects in narrative texts (e.g. feminist, Marxist, postcolonial, intercultural, and ethnic narratology). Most recently, the debate on 'natural' vs. 'unnatural' narratology constitutes an interesting new contribution to the postclassical remodelling of narrative theory.

This conference addresses doctoral students from various disciplines such as literary studies, cultural studies, cognitive studies, history, sociology, philosophy, and theology who share a common interest in narrative theory and storytelling.
